

Welcome to Munich, FNANO's first European venue!

This guide is here to help you find your way around – from the conference venue and lecture halls to lunch and dinner spots.

Getting from the Airport to Munich Central Station

Munich Airport (MUC) is well connected to the city and easy to navigate.


Option 1 (Recommended): S-Bahn (Suburban Train)

Once you exit the arrivals area, simply follow the green “S” signs for the suburban trains (S-Bahn).

Take either **S1** or **S8** – both lines run directly from the airport to Munich Central Station (Hauptbahnhof).

Travel time: approx. 40–45 minutes

Frequency: every 10 minutes (S1 and S8 alternate)

 **Ticket:** Single ticket for zones M–5 (15,10 €) or Airport-City-Day-Ticket if you plan multiple trips (17,50 €). Tickets can be purchased at ticket machines in the airport station (cash or card) or via the MVGO app.

Make sure to validate your ticket before boarding if required!

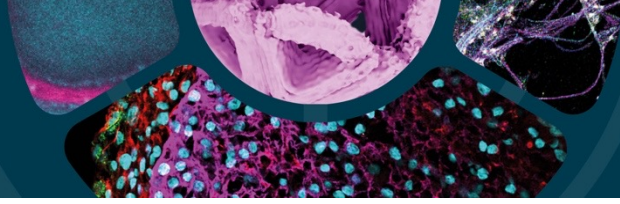
Option 2: Taxi / Uber

Convenient if you have heavy luggage or arrive very late, but significantly more expensive than public transport.

Travel time: 35–50 minutes (depending on traffic)

Cost: approx. 100 € (Taxi)

Munich central station (Hauptbahnhof)

approx. 15 minutes walk

Underground (U2): Königsplatz or Theresienstraße

approx. 7 minutes walk



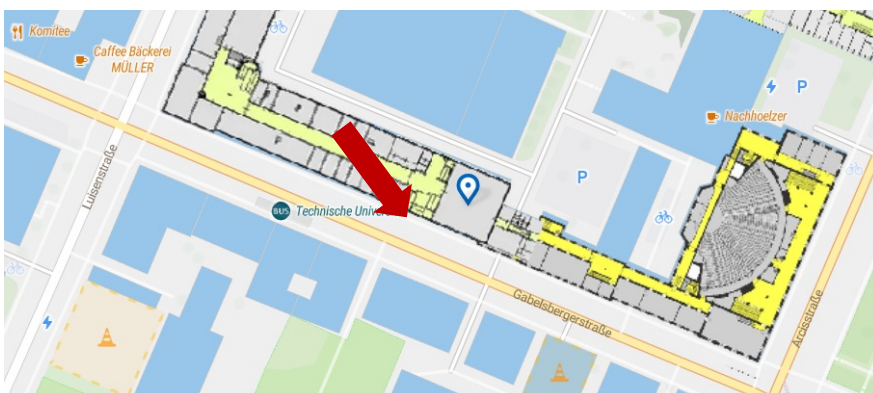
Registration and all conference tracks

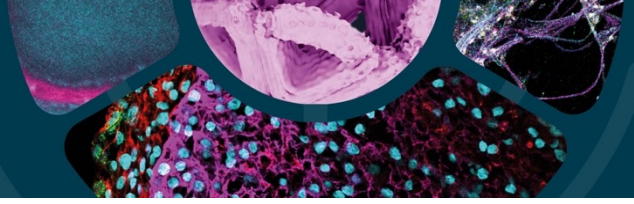
will be held in **Friedrich von Thiersch Lecture Hall 2.300** (2nd floor).

Lunch & Coffee Breaks

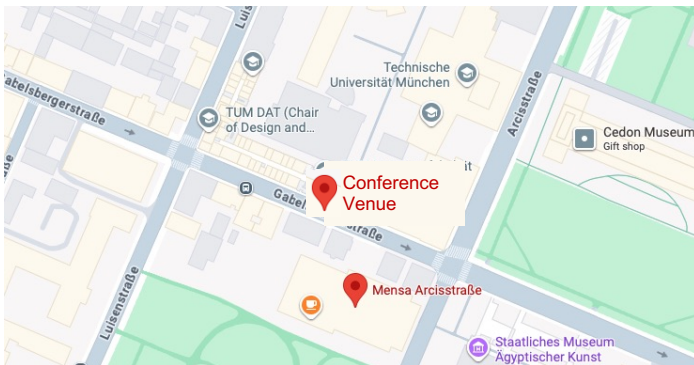
Here's an overview of all planned lunches and evening events during FNANO26.

Group B:  Mon 15:25 – Tue 15:25 – Wed 15:15

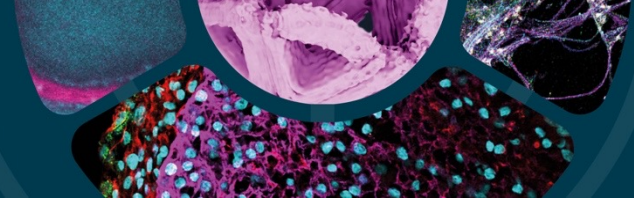

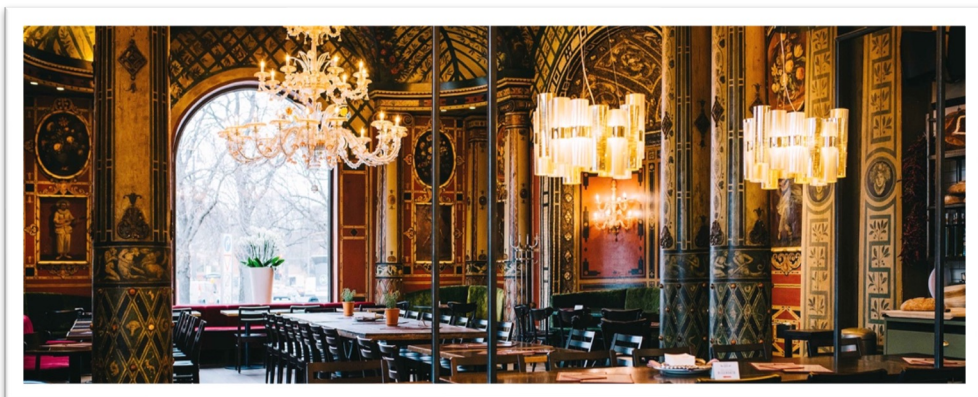

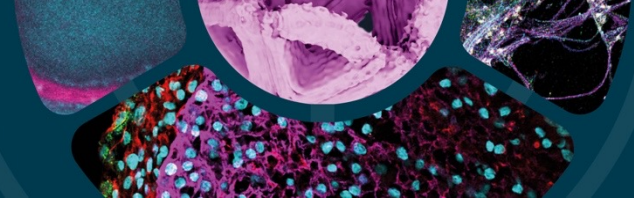
Day 2 (Tuesday, 17 March)
